Project Summary: This summer I traveled to Los Angeles to study mariachi music by working as a musician in the professional world and collaborating with different artists, teachers, and directors. My principal focus was with the Grammy award winning mariachi "Los Camperos de Natí Cano" who are directed by Jesús "Chuy" Guzmán. I sat in on rehearsals and spent time observing how Mr. Guzmán teaches, directs and writes music for Los Camperos.

I also worked with various local area mariachi groups learning the characteristics of local performance, economy, social structure and business practices. I interviewed leading mariachi practitioners and researchers in the field such as Laura Sobrino, Jeff Nevin, Russell Rodriguez, Juan Manuel Cortez, and José L. Hernández. Mr. Hernández allowed me the opportunity to observe rehearsals for his grammy winning Mariachi Sol De Mexico and female Mariachi Reyna de Los Angeles.

I took the opportunity to visit many different restaurant venues to see performances by local mariachi groups from Sol de Mexico, Reyes de Mexico, and Mariachi Las Divas.

I also spent visiting the campus of UCLA and USC which have top departments of music and ethnomusicology. I visited their music libraries and archive collections on commercial and Latin American Music.

I also visited local tailors who make mariachi uniforms and accessories to learn more about the uniforms of the mariachi.
