**Project Summary:** I traveled to South Africa to build on a cross-cultural understanding project with South African youth who are involved in an organization which serves youth communities impacted by HIV and AIDS. I have been collaborating with FXB (Association Francois-Xavier Bagnoud) for the past four years in the capacity of facilitating cultural understanding projects through letter writing, art and video exchanges. Going to South Africa gave me the opportunity to personally meet and connect with the youth whom we've been corresponding with over the years, as well as further developing our project. We spent time engaging in compassionate dialogue about community issues, creating community art, sharing ideas and developing a digital story-telling medium for our future exchanges. Through this collaboration we named our newly developed cultural understanding project, Thetha Jikelele, a Sotho phrase meaning "communication all over."
